Whereas there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at *Gainesville, Florida*, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of *William C. Olds* has been

established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the Lot Numbered one of Section thirty-two, in Township thirty-seven South, and the Lots Numbered one, three and four of Section five, and the Lots Numbered one, two and three of Section eight, in Township thirty-eight South of Range ^{forty} two East of Tallahassee Meridian, in Florida, containing one hundred and thirty-two acres, and eight hundredths of an acre,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *William C. Olds* the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *William C. Olds* and to his heirs and assigns forever.

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
